Programming Keynote Speakers

Keynote speakers throughout the conference include **Sheila Pepe, Josh Faught**, **Jane Lackey** and **Aram Ham Sifuentes**. Additional speakers are scheduled for breakout sessions and demos on Friday and Saturday.

Sheila Pepe

Pepe will explore the cultural agency of textiles and use the silk road as a historic model that highlights promises and pitfalls of contemporary work in textile design and object hood. Best known for her largescale, ephemeral installations and sculpture made from domestic and industrial materials, Pepe is also an educator who likes to trespass the boundaries of fixed disciplines in art and design. She is currently a Core Critic in the Painting + Printmaking Department at Yale University. www.sheilapepe.com




Josh Faught

Josh Faught's practice combines textiles, pop cultural detritus, and archival materials to address the relationships between language, community, and constructions of identity. With a distinguished exhibition career, Faught will produce a large scale work for St. Marks Episcopal Cathedral in Seattle in 2017. Jane Lackey

A visual artist from Santa Fe, Jane Lackey has used multiple processes, surfaces and mark making systems to summon invisible aspects of identity and connection. Her lecture will focus on the conceptual and material substance of marks as both individual and collective signifiers. Her long-time affinity with the medium of fiber is inspired with scientific curiosity, the chemistry of physical sensation, reductive, micro pathways of mapping and durational spatial experience. Aram Han Sifuentes

Aram Han Sifuentes considers the act of protest and how it speaks through the end of the needle in the hands of immigrant laborers in and outside the garment industry. She will discuss her most recent projects:

Official Unofficial Voting Station: Voting for All Who
Legally Can't (2016-2017) and Protest Banner Lending
Library (2017) along with US Citizenship Test Sampler
(2012-present) which address themes of immigrant
labor, immigration policy, citizenship and skill sharing

CONFERENCE HOUSING

HOTEL

REGISTER directly with the hotel by JUNE 3 to obtain best rate. SDA has reserved a room block at University Place Hotel & Conference Center, adjacent to Portland State University, first come, first served. For reservations, please call the hotel 503-221-0140 or 1-866-845-4647 and ask for the "Surface Design Association" room block (rate of \$104 per night plus 15.3% tax). There is a \$10 per person plus tax fee for the 3rd and 4th adult in the room. Wi-Fi and hot food buffet breakfast included. Room block dates are August 3 (check in) to August 6 (check out). If you need to stay before the block date, please let the hotel agent know the block starts on August 3. The hotel is booked after August 6. Parking is charged separately, \$15/night. Cancellations may be made up to 72 hours in advance, minus a \$10 cancellation fee.

University Place Hotel & Conference Center

DORMS, Portland State University

SDA has secured a group of dorm rooms, available on a first come, first served basis at \$68 per night per room. The priority deadline for guaranteed placement is **April 1**. Final registration for dorm rooms is June 3. Your room reservation and payment for other items such as parking (\$15/night) will be made online, directly through PSU using a number we provide. (Please visit the SDA website for updated dormitory information. All rooms offer lodging for one or two people for the same fee (\$68/night); they have private bathrooms, small refrigerator and coffee maker. All reservations will be for a "room," not a double or single. Members will be able to designate who they want as their roommate but only one payment is collected per reservation ("room").


